16th of April, Andrew Jelmert was struck and killed while cycling in Griffith Park. He was pedaling the final stretch of a 67-mile training ride in preparation for a 545-mile ride from San Francisco to LA benefiting the San Francisco AIDS Foundation and the Los Angeles LGBT Center.

On 6/14 the gates on Griffith Park Drive at Travel Town and the gate near Mt. Hollywood Drive will be closed and locked (exempt vehicles ok). RAP is looking to see if by closing the road they can eliminate cut-through freeway traffic and excessive speeding, and make the road safer for passive recreation. Again, this is a pilot program. Any unforeseen impacts on park operations will be addressed immediately.

They should speed bump Griffith Park....grrrr

Last sentence should be:Department of Recreation and Parks.

The motor vehicle lanes are currently very wide and could be narrowed to discourage speeding.
