## What is the Mobility Action Plan (MAP) ?

The MAP will produce two transportation investment list that helps the City of Los Angeles prioritize transportation projects, coordinate resources, and deliver improvements that reflect community needs and City goals. It turns values like safety, access, sustainability, and equity into tangible results.



### Citywide CIP:

- Guides infrastructure investment priorities across all departments
- Compiles information on location, cost and timeline for infrastructure projects

## Why is the MAP important?

The MAP sets investment priorities using a community-first engagement process and a data-driven approach, focusing on what the City can realistically deliver, when, and in what order.

# When will the MAP start delivering results for the City of Los Angeles?

The MAP sets out two transportation investment plans: a five-year plan with funded projects to begin in 2028, and a 20-year plan of unfunded projects to be completed through 2052.

# Mobility Projects and Programs



The MAP will compile and prioritize a list of all transportation infrastructure projects across City departments and include information on project location, cost and timeline

# Project Examples: Pedestrian Infrastructure



- Better sidewalks and crosswalks
- Extended time for crossing the street
- Brighter lighting and visibility on streets/at stops

# Project Examples: Bike Infrastructure



- Bike lanes and safer neighborhood streets for biking
- Bike parking and lockers

# Project Examples: Transit Infrastructure



- **Bus-only lanes to reduce delays**
- **Better bus stops and shelters**
- **Better walk/bike connections to transit**

# Project Examples: Other Street Infrastructure



- **Street repaving**
- **Speed humps and traffic calming**

# Engagement Approach

	CITYWIDE	EQUITY PRIORITY AREAS
PHASE 1: Listening & Visioning	Gather broad input on transportation needs, values, and experiences.	Understand local challenges and community priorities through CBO-led engagement.
PHASE 2: Feedback & Refinement	Share the draft MAP and collect online feedback from residents citywide.	Work with partners and community ambassadors to confirm that the draft reflects local priorities.

# Citywide Engagement Activities

# EPA Engagement Activities

- Partner with 5 local CBOs to co-lead engagement
- Develop localized engagement plans and materials tailored to each EPA
- Conduct pop-ups and co-created community events (e.g., walks, workshops, listening sessions)
